The Importance of Double-Chai

As we recently read in the weekly Torah portion, one of Judaism's most sacred objects was the ancient Menorah, which provided light in the Tabernacle and later the Temple in Jerusalem. For instance, on the holiday of Chanukah, in which the Menorah plays a central role, we light 36 candles to keep the light radiating throughout the world and across the generations.

The Sy Syms School of Business was founded in 1987. That means that 2023 is our 36th ("Double-Chai") anniversary. **Thirty-six years of developing Torah-grounded professionals who excel in the workplace and in the community**, and continue spreading light in everything they do. With record enrollment and the launch of vital curricula for our students (and beyond), we have a lot for which to be thankful.

To mark this milestone year, we have developed a series of activities and events that are tied to monthly themes. Each theme is a strength of the school that we want to celebrate and bring to the broader world.

In particular, here is the thematic lineup throughout the year (except for the summer months):
