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HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL

Ferkauf Graduate School of Psychology is located in the Louis E. and Dora Rousso Community Health Center on Yeshiva University's Jack and Pearl Resnick Campus at Albert Einstein College of Medicine. It developed from the University's School of Education and Community Administration (1948-57) and Graduate School of Education (1957-65). The school was renamed in 1965 to honor the vision and generosity of Eugene and Estelle Ferkauf. It later became Ferkauf Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences (1966-77) and Ferkauf Graduate School (1977-82). In 1975, the Departments of Psychology and Educational Psychology merged to form the University-wide Department of Psychology. The School of Professional Psychology was established at Ferkauf Graduate School in 1979 in response to changing patterns of training in psychology and new patterns of student demand for such training.

Today, Ferkauf is widely respected as a leading training ground for professionals specializing in child-clinical, clinical-health, clinical and counseling psychology.

YESHIVA UNIVERSITY

Yeshiva University is a top-tier national research institution, whose vision embraces the best of Western civilization, along with the ancient traditions of Jewish law and life.

On the undergraduate level, this is embodied in the dual curriculum under which students pursue liberal arts, sciences and business in conjunction with comprehensive Jewish studies. On the graduate level, the University's mission emphasizes the moral dimensions of the search for knowledge and the Jewish ethical values and principles that govern professional practitioners.

Both are linked by a common quest to ennoble students' deepest human needs for purpose and discovery and to enable them to transform their communities and society through meaningful action.

YU's undergraduate schools and divisions include Yeshiva College, Stern College for Women and Sy Syms School of Business. Together with its graduate schools and affiliates-Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law, Wurzweiler School of Social Work, Ferkauf Graduate School of Psychology, Azrieli Graduate School of Jewish Education and Administration, Bernard Revel Graduate School of Jewish Studies, Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary, Yeshiva University High Schools and the Yeshiva University Museum-the University conducts academic and scientific research, issues publications and sponsors service and outreach projects.

In September 2017, Rabbi Dr. Ari Berman was invested as Yeshiva University's fifth president. He succeeded Richard M. Joel, who served as president since 2003, adding to a distinguished lineage that includes Rabbi Norman Lamm, who held the office since 1976; Rabbi Bernard Revel, president from 1915 until his death in 1940; and Rabbi Samuel Belkin, who served from 1943 until his death 33 years later.

Nearly 7,000 students from 38 states and 55 countries study at YU's five campuses: the Wilf Campus; the Israel Henry Beren Campus; Brookdale Center in Manhattan; the Jack and Pearl Resnick Campus in the Bronx; and the Yeshiva University in Israel Campus in Jerusalem.

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
